WHO'S PRESENTING????

Dr. Michael Caldwell, Psy.D.

From Middleton, Wisconsin, Dr. Caldwell is a lecturer at the University of Wisconsin, an investigator with the Mind Research Network at the University of New Mexico, a published author, and a senior staff psychologist at Mendota Juvenile Treatment Center. He also provides his expertise in forensic psychology through his private practice. His specialization is with juvenile sex offenders focusing on risk assessment and treatment. His current area of research focuses on the treatment of aggressive and psychopathic juvenile delinquents and risk assessment of juvenile sexual offenders.

Among his recent publications are: Evidence of Treatment Progress and Therapeutic Outcomes among Adolescents with Psychopathic Features, Are Violent Delinquents worth Treating? A Cost-Benefit Analysis, Accuracy of Sexually Violent Person Assessments of Juvenile Sexual Offenders, and Sex offender registration and recidivism risk in juvenile sexual offenders.

Dr. Brad Johnson, M.D., F.A.P.A.

Dr. Johnson is a psychiatrist in private practice in Tucson who works with adults, adolescents, and children. He is board certified in psychiatry, as well as in forensic psychiatry. In 1999, he became the Chief of Psychiatry at the Arizona Community Protection and Treatment Center in Phoenix, Arizona. Dr. Johnson has maintained a position as an Assistant Clinical Professor at the University of Arizona, Department of Psychiatry. He served as the national Chair of the Assembly Committee of Area Members-in-Training Representatives for the American Psychiatric Association when a resident, and went on to serve as the President of the Arizona Psychiatric Society, the Arizona Deputy Representative to the APA Assembly, and the Public Affairs Representative for the Western states and Canada. He has also served on the Executive Board of the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers. Dr. Johnson has published and presented on such topics as violence, sexual offense, sexual abuse, depression, clinician safety, testifying in court, and other psychiatric and forensic topics.

Dr. David Thornton, Ph.D.

David Thornton obtained his Ph.D. in Psychology in the United Kingdom. About a third of his career has been in research designed to inform clinical practice, about a third of it in clinical practice which he has tried to base on research, and about a third of it has been as an administrator trying to make systems support both research and clinical practice. Between 1990 and 2001 he led the team in Her Majesty's Prison Service responsible for developing and implementing national treatment programs for offenders. Since 2001 he has worked as the treatment director for Wisconsin's SVP treatment program and also as a professor in the department of clinical psychology at the University of Bergen in Norway. He has been involved in the creation of widely used static risk assessment tools (Static-99, Risk Matrix 2000 etc) and in the development of frameworks for evaluating psychological risk factors (the Structured Risk Assessment framework). Recent work has included research into the effects of eating Salmon on Executive Functioning, an MRI study of sexual sadists, and a review of the role of protective factors in sexual recidivism.

Dr. Lee Underwood, PsyD.

Dr. Underwood is a Licensed Clinical Psychologist in several states and Certified Sex Offender Treatment Provider (CSOTP) and serves as the Clinical Director for SequelCare of Arizona. He has served as an Executive Clinical Officer for several large residential treatment, juvenile justice and criminal justice programs. He has worked with justice and residential programs and has been recognized by the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) and the Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA) as one of the leading program innovators for juvenile justice and community treatment programs. He has published over 40 refereed journal articles, 10 technical reports, and 20 treatment manuals/curricula. Currently, Dr. Underwood is tenured Professor with Regent University, School of Psychology and Counseling in Virginia Beach, Virginia and is affiliated with Argosy University Forensic Psychology program in Phoenix, Arizona. He also heads the Center for Addiction and Offender Research and is the Associate Director of the Trauma Center and Addiction Studies at Regent University.
